Facilities

<u>Bayswater Park improvements</u>: Work is progressing to finalise details with Auckland Council for both the design of the new changing room block and the club taking ownership of and renovating the wooden clubhouse. We are working on securing grant funding for the renovation and please support upcoming fundraising initiatives.

<u>Allen Hill improvements</u>: Auckland Council is finalising its upgrade proposal for Dacre Park (aka Allen Hill stadium) and is scheduled to present this to the Devonport-Takapuna Local Board next month. We will provide further updates as the process progresses. The timing of the demolition of the two buildings at 27 Lake Road neighbouring Allen Hill is uncertain at this stage as Auckland Council is still working through the paperwork. The club will be kept informed and there is currently no further update about future use of the site.

We would like to recognise and thank **Mark Collinson** of **Mark Collinson Builders** for his effort and support with essential maintenance and remedial work at Allen Hill and Bayswater. His prompt response and co-ordination of essential work at both sites has been brilliant and generous and we are extremely grateful.

Many of you will have noticed that **Kingdom Decorators** has commenced work painting our Allen Hill club room. We are delighted that this project is underway and to have Kingdom Decorators as a club sponsor from this year.



Teams update

Our **Men's First Team** had a recent solid performance against Ellerslie at Allen Hill, with Ryan Singh coming off the bench to score the winner in his **Skechers** boots. Looking back on the season, coach Dave Fahy considers we should be sitting on 5 or 6 more points which would have the team in contention for promotion. There are some good lessons and takeaways for the team going forward. The team is now focussed on finishing in the top 4. The next two games will be tough against promotion chasing teams, Northern Rovers and Manukau and will be a great test of the team's resilience. We hope to see many supporters at both games and the team is grateful for all the support.

The past month has been a mixed bag for our **Women's First Team**, with two wins and two losses however the squad's hard work and determination throughout have been outstanding. One recent highlight was the team's trip to Waiheke where the team managed to come from behind and secure an excellent 2-1 win, a testament to the team's resilience. The trip also offered a fantastic opportunity for the squad to bond off the pitch. Coach Joe Hughes is excited to see the squad finish the season strong.

23s coach Craig Heslop reflects that it has been rewarding to see the individual progress of many of our **23s** players this season, with several of the squad earning an opportunity to participate in first team football. Our 23s side has an average age of 17 years, so the learning curve has been sharp. The team has been focussed on developing their experience, professionalism, skills, and awareness. The **17s** have trained together with the 23s for most of the season which has enabled smoother transitions between the teams. The 17s have really evolved in terms of unity, performance and results this year. This development and performance of both teams is exciting for the future of the club.

In July, our **junior teams** proudly represented the club at festivals across Auckland, displaying their passion and talent on the field. On July 17th, we had a Grade 9 and Grade 10 team compete at the Manurewa FC Festival, while on July 20th, a Grade 11 team and two Grade 12 teams took part in the Albany FC Festival. These festivals are fantastic opportunities for our players to challenge themselves against some of Auckland's best teams. The intensive festival schedules create an environment for growth—helping players sharpen their skills, learn tactics, and build stronger connections with their teammates. Beyond the pitch, these events strengthen the bonds between players, parents, and the wider club community. A heartfelt thank you goes out to all the parents who help bring these events to life. From organising baking, barbeques, etc, through to those that spend the day coaching and refereeing—your dedication is hugely appreciated. It is certainly hard work, and the beers after the final whistle are well-earned!
